- Invented devices that advance the technical performance of gymnastics elements or promote a safe gymnastics environment
- Has written or contributed to significant gymnastics books, monographs, and articles
- Has produced research advancing the sport

 - National committees (years and offices held)
 - Regional and state service (years and offices held)
 - Books or articles published
 - Development of significant ideas which have benefited the gymnastics community
 - Judging service and major assignments (Olympic, World Championships, international &/or national competitions)
 - Service to the gymnastics community (volunteer contributions not covered above)
2. Was this nominee a competitor in gymnastics? If so, list background, years and results.
3. Was this nominee a gymnastics coach? If so, list years and achievements.
